HOW TO JUDGE PEOPLE AND THINGS

Context:

In missing the heart of God — the very purpose of God to do people good — the religious people mistook everything. If we are off in our perception of what God is really like, we will not know how to evaluate life around us.

- 1. Right things please God's heart; wrong things break it.
- 2. Righteous judgement compares what is true of God with what is true of people and things.

How to Judge Like Jesus Judges (Isaiah 11:1-5)

- 3. Be full of the Spirit, not full of yourself.
- 4. Don't be wise in your own eyes.
- 5. Understand things scripturally and spiritually -- not naturally, intellectually, emotionally, logically, rationally, experientially, academically, psychologically, theoretically or professionally.
- 6. Listen for counsel from God.
- 7. Don't get drawn into a contest of wills, intellect, or abilities to prove your personal strength. Stay weak and insignificant.
- 8. Remember that *real* knowledge acknowledges the Lord. Any bit of knowledge which doesn't, won't help you truly figure things out.
- 9. Don't evaluate things on the basis of how they look or sound on the surface. Most real issues -- the kind that really make any profound difference -- are seldom what can be perceived naturally.
- 10. What is right already exists. Use what is right to judge things; don't look at things in order to judge what is right.
- 11. God champions the afflicted. Judging correctly involves seeing who God wants to help, and how.
- 12. Any correct evaluation will fit into Scripture and can be supported by verses from the Bible.
- 13. Never leave the ways of God in order to make decisions or to offer counsel to others.
